Declaration of Alma-Ata

International Conference on Primary Health Care, Alma-Ata, USSR, 6-12 September 1978

The International Conference on Primary Health Care, meeting in Alma-Ata this twelfth day of September in the year Nineteen hundred and seventy-eight, expressing the need for urgent action by all governments, all health and development workers, and the world community to protect and promote the health of all the people of the world, hereby makes the following

Primary health care - now more than ever

14 October 2008

Ladies and gentlemen,

I believe that the world, as it stands now, is out of balance in matters of health as never before. This year's World Health Report supports my conviction.

Thirty years ago, in this city, the Declaration of Alma-Ata launched primary health care as the route to health for all. This was a deliberate effort to tackle huge, and largely avoidable, differences in the health status of populations. The declaration put health equity on the international political agenda for the first time.

Why was this so important? What does health equity mean? It means that people should not be denied access to life-saving and health-promoting interventions for unfair reasons, including those with economic or social causes. Simply stated: equity in health is of life-and-death importance.

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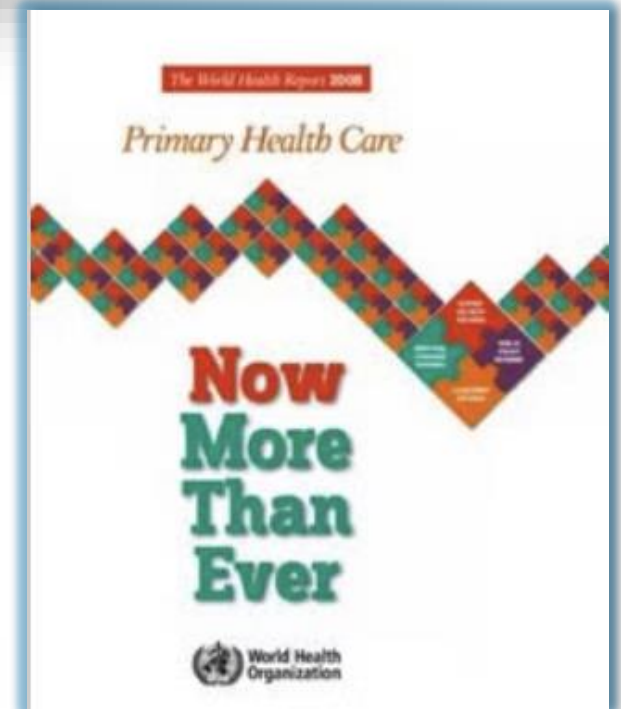

The Alma-Ata Declaration of 1978 emerged as a major milestone of the twentieth century in the field of public health, as it identified primary health care as the key to the attainment of the goal of Health for All. The following are excerpts from the Declaration:

- The Conference strongly reaffirms that health, which is a state of complete physical, mental, and social well-being, and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity, is a fundamental human right and that the attainment of the highest possible level of health is a most important world-wide social goal whose realization requires the action of



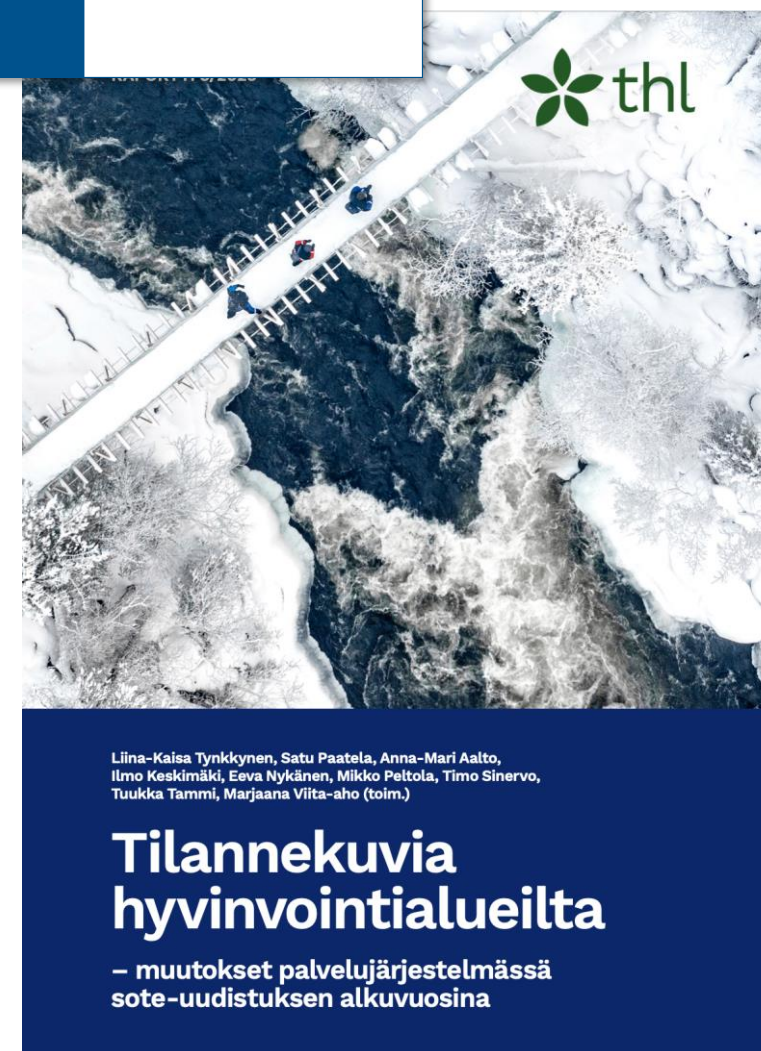
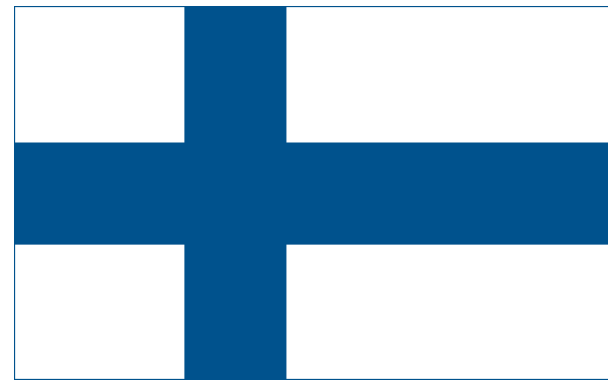
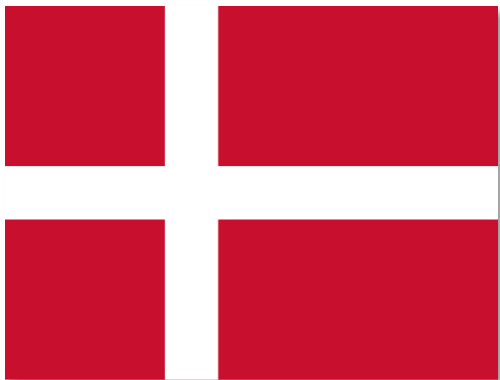
